

## The Arch of Titus Yields its Mysteries

- 1. 17 Tammuz-Prelude to tragedy
- 2. Destruction of 2<sup>nd</sup> Temple weighs more heavily upon us
- Rome=Villainous, wicked government.
- 4. Arch of Titus (82ce): Sack of Jerusalem=victory of the century for Rome.
- 5. (This concept explains the midrash of Yosef Meshita.)
- 6. The civic centre of Rome was remodelled to reflect the victory over the Jews and their G-d.
- 7. Sack of Jerusalem: Roman gods, and in particular Jupiter, had defeated the G-d of Israel.
- 8. After hurban, dues paid to Beit ha-Mikdash now paid to Temple of Jupiter.
- A generation later, Hadrian would even establish a shrine to Jupiter on the Temple Mount in Jerusalem.
- 10. A closer look at the Arch: Titus at the apex of the passageway rising to Heaven on the back of an eagle above the spoils panel and Victories hovering in the spandrels. Becoming a god himself.
- 11. Spoils from Judea pay for the Colosseum as well as the "Temple of Peace", where treasures from the Temple were displayed.
- 12. Yet, the victory lap proved premature. Judaism continued to exist even in the absence of the *korbanot*. Torah and mitzvot.
- 13. Irony: Jews sometimes accused of being atheists and persecuted accordingly, because they did not worship the gods.
- 14. Menorah most prominent symbol on the Arch. Specifically chosen as emblem of the State of Israel.
- 15. Problem of the Pedestal
  - a. Should be a tripod
  - Dragons, yet Talmud says one who finds a vessel with a carving or picture of a dragon, should throw it into the Dead Sea
- 16. Chief Rabbi Yitzchok Herzog: Tripod must have been detached in transit, and a Roman artisan replaced it with the decorative pedestal.
- 17. Prof. Daniel Sperber: Herod added the dragons—ingratiate himself with Rome
- 18. Rabbi Herzog distressed at the choice of this menorah as emblem of the State of Israel.
- 19. Evidence for Torah Scroll as the climactic feature of the triumphal procession.
- 20. Margolis and Marx: "One thing the fury of legions was powerless to destroy, the invincible Torah of the Jew."
